

Blackjack-

The game of Blackjack, also known as Twenty-One, is a fast, exciting and popular card game. It is played with either six decks of cards or two decks of cards. The object of the game is to hold a hand higher than the dealer's hand without going over twenty-one. Kings, queens and jacks count as ten points. Aces count as either one or eleven. All other cards count as face value. Players may play two hands provided they wager at least double the table minimum on both bets. A maximum of three hands may be played provided the wager is at least five times the table minimum on all three bets. If 3 hands are played and the player goes back to 1 or 2 hands the player may not play 3 hands again until the next shoe. If the table is a posted no-mid shoe entry and the player starts off playing 2 or 3 hands and then decides to play fewer hands they may not go back up in hands until the next shoe. The player places a wager in the bet area. The player receives two cards face up. The dealer receives one card face up and one card face down. The face down card is known as the hole card. The player now has the option to draw additional cards to improve the value of their hand. This is called hitting. The player also has the option to stay with the two cards he/she already has. This is called standing. If the player wishes to hit their hand they may take as many cards as they want as long as the hand does not go over twenty-one. When a player's hand goes **over** twenty-one the hand is a bust and the bet is lost. A player may double down on their hand by placing a wager which is exactly the same or less than their original wager next to their original wager. The player would receive **one** additional card to go along with their original two cards and cannot go over twenty-one. A player may split their hand if the first two original cards have the same value. To do this the player would make another wager **exactly the same** as their original bet. The player would then be able to hit each of these hands as many times as they wish as long as the hands do not go over twenty-one. A player is allowed to split their hand up to **three** times for a total of 4 hands. A player may only split aces one time and they only get one card. If the dealer has an ace as their face up card the players will have the option to take insurance. To do this the player would place a wager half the value or less of his original wager on the insurance line. If the dealer **does not** have a blackjack the player would lose the insurance wager. If the dealer **does have** a blackjack the player who took insurance would lose the original wager but would win the insurance wager at odds of two to one. If the player has a blackjack and the dealer has a blackjack the player's original bet would be a push and the insurance would get paid at odds of two to one. If the player has a blackjack they are allowed to request even money before the dealer looks to see if he/she has a blackjack. They would be paid even money on their wager and the cards would be picked up and put in the discard rack. After all the players have played their cards and all the busted wagers and hands have been collected the dealer will expose their hole card. The dealer must hit any hand with a value of sixteen or less and stand on any hand with a value of seventeen or more. The dealer always hits a soft seventeen. This is a hand where the ace can be used as a one or eleven making the hand a value of seven or seventeen. If the dealer's hand goes **over** twenty-one all remaining wagers in action will win even money. If the dealer's hand **does not** go **over** twenty-one all remaining wagers in action must have a higher hand than the dealer to win even money. All hands less than the dealer's hand lose and will be collected by the dealer. When the dealer's hand and the player's hand are **equal** in value the hand is a push and no one wins or loses. A **blackjack** is the first two **natural** cards dealt to a player or dealer with a value of twenty-one. A blackjack pays two to one. If both the player and the dealer have a blackjack the hand is a push. Blackjack wins all hands except a push.

Buster Blackjack-

Buster Blackjack is a variation of blackjack. It may be dealt using one to eight decks of cards. It features a side bet that allows the player to bet that the dealer will bust. Prior to the dealing of any cards, all players must make a mandatory blackjack wager up to the posted table limit. In addition to the blackjack wager, the player also has the option to make a "Dealer Buster" side bet. This side bet allows the player to win odds up to 250 to 1 if the dealer's hand busts.

Ultimate Texas Hold'em-

Ultimate Texas Hold'em is a casino game based on the version of poker known as Texas Hold'em. It is played on a blackjack size table. It is played with one deck of cards. Ultimate Texas Hold'em features head-to-head play against the dealer and an optional bonus bet. Standard poker rankings determine winning hands. The following wagers can be made. Trips: To make this wager you place cheques in the trips area at the beginning of the game. The player is betting that they will have a five-card hand of three of a kind or better. Ante: To make this wager you place cheques in the ante area at the beginning of the game. To win this bet the player must beat the dealer's pair or better hand. Blind: To make this wager you place cheques equal to your ante wager in the blind area at the beginning of the game. To win this bet the player must beat the dealer's hand with a straight or better. Play: A player who makes this wager has decided to call the dealer's hand. The player may bet three times or four times their ante wager before the flop. The player may bet two times their ante wager after the flop. And the player may bet one times their ante wager after the turn and river. Once a player bets the play wager they cannot bet again and they cannot change their bet. The player makes a wager of equal value on both the ante and blind wager. They may also make a trips bet. Each player receives two cards. The dealer will receive 2 cards. Five cards are placed face down in the center of the layout for community cards. The players look at their cards and decide to check or make a play bet of three or four times their ante wager. Once a player bets they cannot bet again and they cannot change their bet. The dealer turns up the first three community cards. Players who have not made a play bet now have the option to check or make a play bet of two times their ante wager. The dealer then turns up the final two community cards. Players who have not made a play bet now have the option to fold or make a play bet of one times their ante wager. The dealer reveals his two hole cards and announces his five-card hand. The dealer must have a pair to qualify. If the dealer qualifies he/she will combine each player's hole cards with the community cards to make the best five-card hand. If the player's hand beats the dealer's the play and ante bets win even money. If the player's hand loses to the dealer the play, ante and blind bets lose. When the hands tie the play, ante and blind bets push. The blind bet wins when the player wins with a straight or higher. Odds are paid per the blinds payout schedule. If the player wins with less than a straight the blind pushes. The trips bet wins if the player has three of a kind or better. Odds are paid per the trips payout schedule. If the dealer does not qualify he/she will refund each player's ante bet. This is done before looking at any of the player's hands. The dealer will then combine each player's hole cards with the community cards to make the best five-card hand. If the player's hand beats the dealer's the play wins even money. If the player's hand loses to the dealer the play and blind bets lose. When the hands tie the play and blind bets push. The blind bet wins when the player wins with a straight or higher. Odds are paid per the blinds payout schedule. If the player wins with less than a straight the blind pushes. The trips bet wins if the player has three of a kind or better. Odds are paid per the trips payout schedule.

High Card Flush-

High Card Flush is an exciting new game where players try to beat the dealer by getting the most number of cards of the same suit (a flush) in their hand. To play, players must make an Ante wager and may make the optional Flush and/or Straight Flush Bonus wagers. Then, players will receive seven cards face-down with the object of the game being to have more cards of the same suit (a flush) than the dealer. If the player and dealer have the same number of cards in their flush, the winning hand is determined by the highest ranking card (Ace - 2) of the flush in each hand. If the highest cards are the same, it moves to the next highest card until a winner or tie is determined. After examining their cards, players must either place a Raise wager or fold and surrender their Ante. With less than five suited cards, players must match their Ante with their Raise wager. If players have five suited cards, they can double their Ante for their Raise wager. For six or seven suited cards, players can triple their Ante on their Raise wager. Once all players have acted on their hand, the dealer's cards are exposed. The dealer's hand must qualify with a 9 high three card flush. If the dealer does not qualify, all remaining players will be paid on their Ante and their Raise wagers will push. If the dealer qualifies and the player's hand ranks higher than the dealer's hand, the Ante and Raise wagers win and are paid even money. If the dealer qualifies and the player's hand ranks lower than the dealer's hand, the Ante and Raise wagers lose and are collected. If the dealer qualifies and the player's hand ties the dealer's hand, the Ante and Raise wagers push. The optional Flush Bonus wager is paid when players have at least four suited cards in their hand. The optional Straight Flush Bonus wager is paid when players have at least a three card straight flush in their hand.

Craps -

Craps is a dice game revolving around the roll of two dice. Players wager against the casino on the outcome of one roll or a series of rolls. Craps can be played with 1 or more players. Players take turns rolling the dice. The player rolling the dice is called the shooter. The game is played in rounds. The first roll of a new round is called the come-out roll. On the come-out roll if the total of the two dice are 7, 11, 2, 3 or 12 the round ends immediately and the shooter must roll another come-out roll. A result of 2, 3 or 12 is called craps while a result of 7 or 11 is called a win or a natural. When any other number (4, 5, 6, 8, 9 or 10) is rolled on the come-out roll this number becomes what is called the point. If a point is established then the shooter will re-roll the dice continuously until either a 7 is rolled or the point is rolled again. If the shooter rolls the point again the round ends and the game starts over with the same shooter rolling another come-out roll. If the shooter rolls a 7 instead of the point, this is called seven-out the round ends and the dice pass to the next player to the left who becomes the new shooter.

Fortune Pai Gow Poker -

Pai Gow Poker is played on a blackjack size table. On each hand the dealer plays against the other players. It is played with a standard deck of cards plus one joker. The joker may be used to complete a royal flush, straight flush, flush, straight, or used as an ace. Standard poker rankings determine winning hands. Seven cards are dealt to each player. All players, other than the dealer, look at their hands and divide them to form two hands, a two-card hand and a five-card hand. The player must arrange the cards so that the five-card hand is higher than the two card hand. Cards have the same value as a standard poker hand. Both hands are then placed facedown in front of the player. All players hands are exposed. If the player's two-card hand and their five-card hand can beat the dealer's two-card hand and five-card hand, the players wins the bet. If the

players wins one hand but the dealer wins one hand it is considered a push and no money changes hands. If the dealer wins both hands the dealer wins the players stake.

In Fortune Pai Gow the players may also make an additional "bonus" wager separate from the original "bet" wager. In the event of a "push" with the player not receiving a bonus, the dealer takes the "bonus" wager.

Let It Ride Three Card Bonus Poker -

Each player places three equal bets. Three cards are dealt to each player. You are not playing against the dealer or the other players. You are trying to get the best possible hand by using your three cards and 2 cards, called "Community Cards", which the dealer will expose. After looking at your first three cards, you may ask for your first bet back or you may "Let It Ride." The dealer then turns up one community card. You may then ask for your second bet back or you may "Let It Ride." The second community card is then turned over by the dealer. At this point, all winning hands are paid according to the payout schedule.

Electronic Roulette-

Electronic Roulette uses a virtual dealer and each player has their own screen in front of them to place their bets. The Electronic Roulette table can be played by 6 players at a time. There is a time limit for all players to place their bets.

Roulette is a casino game where a dealer spins a wheel in one direction, then spins a ball in the opposite direction around a tilted circular surface running around the circumference of the wheel. The ball eventually falls on to the wheel and into one of the 38 colored and numbered pockets on the wheel. The main pockets are numbered from 1 to 36 alternating between red and black, but the pockets are not in numerical order around the wheel. There are instances of consecutive numbers being the same color. There is a green pocket numbered 0 and another green pocket numbered 00. Players can place a variety of "inside" bets (selecting the number of the pocket the ball will land in, or the range of pockets based on their position), and "outside" bets (including bets on various positional groupings of pocket colors, or whether it is odd or even). The payout odds for each type of bet are based on its probability.

Electronic Blackjack -

Electronic Blackjack follows the same rules as blackjack played on the table. The Electronic Blackjack table can be played by 5 players at a time. It uses a virtual dealer and each player has their own screen in front of them to place their bets. There is a time limit for all players to place their bets.
